DAY 1

Caraquet, 320 km from Edmundston

Dive into history in the footsteps of the Acadian people and their French heritage. You'll be inspired by their charming accents and traditions.

Hit the road, travel the Acadian Peninsula and spend the night in Caraquet. Turn on the radio and be lulled by the music of proud people. Food, museums and festivals are part of the package deal.

DAY 2

BOISHÉBERT AND BEAUBEAR ISLAND SHIPBUILDING

Miramichi, 125 km from Caraquet

Meet colourful characters, dressed in authentic garb, who engage guests with spirited retellings of a history both tumultuous and triumphant: the Acadian Deportation.

At night, enjoy a celestial masterpiece in a national park Dark Sky Preserve.

DAY 3
KOUCHIBOUGUAC

At Kouchibouguac, meaning “river of long tides” – Mi’kmaw origin, begin your adventure with a scenic stroll atop Kellys Beach Boardwalk. Here, you can wander above the salt-marsh grasses toward lagoons brimming with life.

With an engaging interpretive guide at the lead, explore the home of dozens of vital marine species including hermit crabs, mussels and oysters. Set out on a marine adventure with the Voyageur Canoe, and paddle to a bustling colony of grey seals.

DAY 4
MONUMENT-LEFEBVRE

Memramcook, 115 km from Kouchibouguac

FORT BEAUSÉJOUR - FORT CUMBERLAND

Aulac, 35 km from Memramcook

Journey into the past and vibrant future of the Acadian people, alive in music and history, while visiting a proud symbol of contemporary *Acadie*.

History buffs and culture lovers will enjoy touring the ruins of the fort. Engage in stories and be held spellbound – feel a connection to the soldiers and settlers who once called this place home. You’ll be swept away by the site’s panorama of land, sea, sky and story.

DAY 5
GRAND-PRÉ
265 km from Aulac

Once the epicentre of Acadian culture and now the most significant memorial to a tragic upheaval. At the heart of a UNESCO World Heritage Site, uncover the tale of *Le Grand Dérangement* through engaging multimedia; don’t forget to bring your tissues! Admire the statue of Evangeline, heroine of an epic Longfellow poem. You will be amazed by the *aboiteau*, an Acadian marvel.

DAY 6
PORT-ROYAL
125 km from Grand-Pré

Step into a reconstructed early 17th-century French colony and interact with the costumed interpreters. They will happily answer any questions you may have and point out fascinating facts about the resident explorers.

Then, the road will take you to the Melanson Settlement for a stroll along the uplands of the Annapolis River to a pre-Deportation site of an Acadian settlement. Through Interpretive panels, learn about the lives of this close-knit community of families and neighbours farming together on the dyke-land.

DAY 7
FORT ANNE
Annapolis Royal, 10 km from Port-Royal

Discover the birthplace of Acadian culture in Annapolis Royal. Tour the museum and grounds with a tablet and learn about the fort’s volatile past including the story of the first families of Acadia.

Enjoy the *Candlelight graveyard tour* and hear the fascinating past of those buried there, many of whom share their ancestry with present day Acadians.

DAY 1 KEJIMKUJIK

Maitland Bridge, 170 km from Halifax

Just like generations of families before, enjoy some invigorating outdoor recreation and a cultural awakening. Hike along the forested riverbanks of the rushing Mersey River to Mills Falls for a picnic.

In the evening, take advantage of Nova Scotia's only Dark Sky Preserve and observe the starry skies during a guided program, or rent a Dark Sky Kit and explore at your own pace.

DAY 2

Begin your day with a guided tour of the Mi'kmaw petroglyphs and discover 4,000 years of history. Explore the traditional Mi'kmaw waterways in a canoe or kayak; better yet, climb aboard a 38'-Mi'kmaw Canoe for a guided paddle.

DAY 3 KEJIMKUJIK SEASIDE

Port Joli, 95 km from Maitland Bridge

Travel along the Kejimikujik Scenic Drive on route 8 to a coastal paradise. Marvel at tropic-like white sand beaches and turquoise waters: the perfect spot for a picnic.

Witness seals basking off-shore and if you're lucky, catch a glimpse of the endearing and endangered piping plover.

How can we protect our coastal heritage from the effects of climate change?


Coastal erosion puts our cultural treasures and important archaeology, like the 18th-century burial grounds at the Fortress of Louisbourg, at risk.
