

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












ROAD TRIPS AND ITINERARIES







"BACKYARD" FAMILY FUN

Explore lush forests, sandy beaches, and ancient cultural sites on this 3-day family getaway. Climb aboard a historic warship, and even take part in a musket-firing experience. This adventure combines nature, history, and hands-on activities and is ideal for families looking to explore and enjoy the outdoors while learning about Canada's past.

Rouge National Urban Park

 Discover Canada's first national urban park! Full of amazing hiking opportunities, join a guided walk and learn about the park's rare forests. restored wetlands, farm landscapes and stunning fall colours.

 Explore the decks and imagine yourself as a crew member on the world's last surviving Tribal Class destrover ship.



Woodside National Historic Site





• Tour the preserved Victorian childhood home of William Lyon Mackenzie King filled with heirlooms and historic trinkets, then wander the grounds to discover 4.65 hectares of wooded areas, gardens, lawns, and serene pathways.



Fort George National Historic Site



1.5 hours

- · Head to the Niagara Peninsula and tour the principal fortification during the war of 1812. Enter the gates and explore the Soldiers' Barracks or tap your toes to the marching tunes of the 41st Regiment Fife and Drum Corps.
- Head to nearby Queenston Heights National Historic Site to climb the 235 circular steps to the top of Brock's Monument for a spectacular view of the Niagara Frontier.



Trent-Severn Waterway National Historic Site



- Drive to one of the 42 lockstations along the system and marvel at these historic structures still operating today.
- See the Peterborough Lift Lock rise high into the air, watch the Big Chute Marine Railway carry boats over the roadway, or plan a picnic in the heart of a cottage town.

THE CHALLENGE

How can we address the decline of reptiles and amphibians in southern Ontario? Working together to make roads safer for wildlife is one of the best ways to help.

A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Parks Canada works with Indigenous communities, volunteers, universities, and other conservation groups to build eco-passages and track the movements of animals between important habitats. They also protect turtle nests from traffic and predators and increase turtle hatchling survival rates with egg incubation programs. Visitors have the opportunity to play an important role in the protection of these animals by obeying traffic signs and reporting wildlife sightings in the free iNaturalist app.

THE RESULT

Since 2020, over 8 000 animals have been documented using 5 eco-passages, 800 nest boxes have been installed with volunteers, and over 8 000 baby turtles have been released with partners.


