EXPERIENCE FOREST BATHING

FORILLON NATIONAL PARK

Humans have always sought peace within calm wilderness. The notion of 'shinrin yoku', the practice of 'bathing' in the forest amongst the trees, emerged in Japan in the 1950s. Forillon National Park, situated at the tip of the Gaspé Peninsula, has so many forest bathing choices.

IF YOU'RE A DAY TRIPPER

Begin with experiencing the Mont-Saint-Alban area in **Forillon National Park**, which first envelops you within its forest cover, and then surprises with grand land and seascapes, climaxed by a 285-metre-high lookout tower

with 360-degree vistas of the ocean, forests and the cliffs of Land's End. There are three routes by which to reach the tower, ranging from 3.6km to 7.8km return. Whether you leave from Petit-Gaspé beach, Cap-Bon-Ami,

or Grande-Grave, you will be blown away by the impressive views. Binoculars are a must in hopes of spotting Blue, fin, minke and humpback whales.

IF YOU'RE AN OVERNIGHTER

DAY 1: Enroute to **Forillon**, enjoy the ever-changing light of nearby Percé Rock (93 km preceding Forillon), a massive sheer rock rising out of Percé Bay that is central to the **UNESCO Global Geopark of Percé**.

Upon arrival at the park, embark on the *La Taïga* trail (4.8 km return) in Penouille, the park's only white sandy beach. The trail is a journey through space and time. The Penouille sand spit supports a taiga whose presence at such low latitudes

is quite unusual. A selection of camping and roofed accommodations are available in the Town of Gaspé.

DAY 2: Day two begins with a visit to *La Chute* (1 km loop), situated just off Route 132. This trail leads you into a valley, the atmosphere which wraps you in large, mature maple and cedar trees. In a sense, you plunge into the forest, with the sound of flowing water gradually intensifying until you reach your reward, a 17-metre waterfall.

Drive 18.4 km to L'Anse-au-Griffon, where there are two trail experiences, *Le Portage* (20 km return) or *La Vallée* (9.2 km return). *Le Portage* passes through forests and waterways including the L'Anse-au-Griffon River. *La Vallée* is the hottest place in the park, having its own micro-climate, where you'll encounter yellow birch, a stand of cedars, and maple trees. The red and sugar maples, combined with birches, produce a kaleidoscope of red and orange leaves.

IF YOU'RE A WEEKENDER

DAY 1: Day one begins by first visiting **Percé**, and then settling in at **Forillon National Park** to explore the *La Taïga* trail and enjoy Penouille's sandy beach.

DAY 2: Day two includes forest bathing excursions to *La Chute* and your choice of *Le Portage* or *La Vallée* trails.

DAY 3: Don't miss the *Les Graves* Trail which leads you through boreal forests and flowery fields towards pebbled beaches and the sea. Set out on the trail from either Grande-Grave (15.2 km return) to add a cultural experience to your hike, the trailhead at L'Anse-aux-Amérindiens (6.4 km gravel road return), or the alternative L'Anse-aux-Amérindiens trail

(8 km return). The overall objective is to arrive at Cap-Gaspé, the tip of a limestone headland where the cliffs fall dramatically, nearly 213 meters into the sea. Complete your *Les Graves* experience by following the trail down to the bottom of the cliff until reaching the final tip of Land's End, where you'll quickly feel a sense of peace and Zen.

30 minutes 1.5 hours

- Sail on Canada's busiest lock, a paradise for recreational boaters and an adventure for kayakers.
- Laze under a tree with a picnic or hit the boardwalk and enjoy a sunset meal at one of the bistros or restaurants.

Fort Chambly and Chambly Canal

40 minutes 50 minutes

- Discover what a soldier's life was like in this French stone fort. Will you earn the privilege of wearing the uniform?
- Visit Chambly Canal along the Richelieu River. Hike, bike, or simply admire boats passing through the locks that are still operated manually.

Fort Lennox

50 minutes

- Explore the fort's strategic location on an island, right in the heart of the magnificent Richelieu River.
- Discover the island's occupation from 6,000 B.C. to the present, exploring the brand new exhibition.

Battle of the Châteauguay

1 hour 1.5 hours

- Pedal what was once a battleground and is now a 19 km interpretive trail along the Châteauguay River.
- Dive into the battle that stopped an American invasion of Montreal in 1813 and discover the daily lives of Canadian militiamen.

Coteau-du-Lac

1 hour 1.5 hours

- Pedal along the Soulanges canal on the Archeostroll ride, exploring the unique archaeology that lies on this 45 km trail.
- Explore your way through Canada's first fortified lock canal, photographing items in a race against the clock!

CONSERVING FOR THE FUTURE

THE CHALLENGE

How can we protect coastal environments from the effects of climate change?

Coastal erosion is increasing due to rising sea levels, decreasing sea ice, as well as roads and buildings not suited to a coastal environment in the active shoreline zone.

A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Restoration actions are being adopted in Forillon National Park, such as a raised boardwalk, a stilt building, the relocation of a road, and the revegetation of the shoreline with seaside plants that are essential for beach maintenance.

THE RESULT

More natural beaches and facilities adapted to coastal dynamics will improve the park's resiliency in the face of climate change and provide visitors access to this exceptional ecosystem.

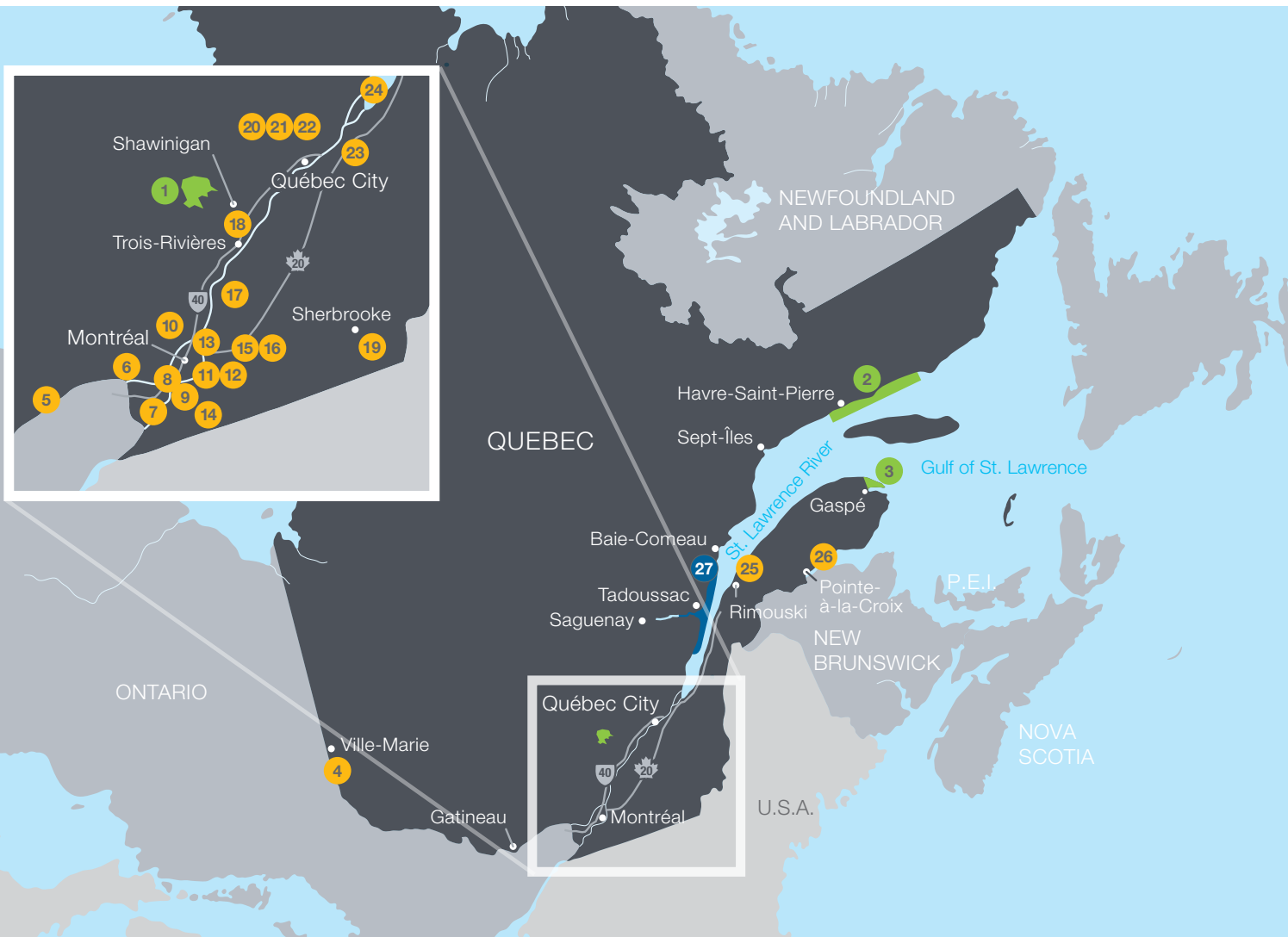

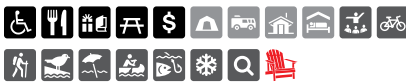


1 La Mauricie

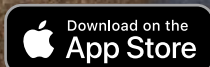

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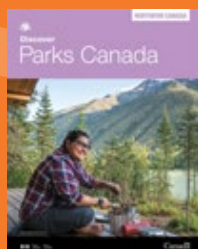
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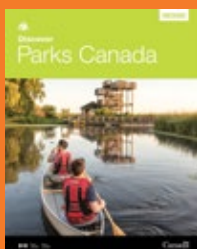
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
