DAY 1 GULF OF GEORGIA CANNERY Richmond, 20 km from Vancouver

Discover the fascinating history of British Columbia and marvel at the wonders of the ocean!

Experience the early days of the west coast fishing industry. Learn the different methods of fishing and salmon canning. Hear captivating fishermen's tales. Feel the charm of the picturesque fishing village of Steveston.

DAY 2 FORT LANGLEY AND GULF ISLANDS

Travel to the turn of the 19th century to become a Hudson's Bay Company worker at the birthplace of British Columbia. Mingle with fur traders; hone your skills with a blacksmith; practice barrel-making; visit the farm animals; and pan for gold – you might just strike it rich!

Head to Sidney on the Tsawwassen ferry to Swartz Bay sailing through the beautiful Gulf Islands.

DAY 3

Ready for adventure? Enjoy a day trip on Saturna Island. Hike or drive up the dirt track to the summit of Mount Warburton Pike to enjoy astonishing views of the Gulf Islands stretched out before you.

Head to East Point to do some whale watching from dry land; you might spot some of the resident orcas! While you're there, visit the Heritage Centre and learn about the history of the island.

Enjoy a spectacular sunset before heading back to the ferry for Sidney.

DAY 4

Want a relaxing day at the beach? Walk aboard the passenger ferry for Sidney Island, and cruise across Sidney Channel. In no time at all, you'll be gleefully kicking off your shoes and strolling on the sun-warmed sand. Enjoy a picnic watching the turquoise waves crash off Sidney Spit before a relaxing afternoon kite flying and building sand castles.

Intrigued by nature? Once back at Sidney, stop by the Shaw Centre for the Salish Sea aquarium and discover local marine life secrets with Parks Canada interpreters.

DAY 5 FORT RODD HILL AND FISGARD LIGHTHOUSE

Victoria, 30 km from Sidney

En route to the provincial capital! Spend your morning strolling through the narrow streets of Victoria's heritage districts. Be sure to check out Chinatown, Canada's oldest and most colourful Chinese neighbourhood. Sample English-style tea and enjoy a plate of fish and chips before heading to Fort Rodd Hill, only a few kilometres from downtown.

DAY 6

Let's go! Discover the oldest artillery fort on Canada's west coast. Explore secret bunkers, military command posts and 19th century buildings at Fort Rodd Hill. Listen to moving stories of soldiers and their families. In the summer, get an introductory lesson in target shooting using a replica WWII machine gun.

Watch the sunset from the lighthouse, then enjoy a night telling stories around the campfire.

After waking up to the sound of birds singing, soak up the beauty of the sunrise at the lighthouse. Take a walk through a Garry oak meadow and see if you can find any Camassia, a plant used as a food source by local First Nations.

THE CHALLENGE

What can we do to address climate change and fight global warming?

Carbon dioxide is a major greenhouse gas and driver of climate change, however salt marsh ecosystems can store large amounts of CO₂ for much longer than mature forests.

THE RESULT?

Understanding how these ecosystems work will hopefully encourage everyone to be more environmentally conscious.



A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

In an international effort, Parks Canada Coastal Ecologists are studying the effect that eelgrass meadow and tidal salt marshes have on absorbing carbon dioxide.







Canada's most famous hot springs are in the Canadian Rockies National Parks.

There's nothing like soaking in hot, naturally heated mineral water surrounded by dramatic mountain scenery.

For centuries, Indigenous peoples used these springs as sacred places while travelling through the Canadian Rockies. Today, the iconic Banff Upper Hot Springs continue to delight and welcome visitors as it has for over 130 years. Get off the beaten path and visit Radium Hot Springs in Kootenay National Park. This hot spring is nestled within the stunning rock walls of Sinclair Canyon. Jasper's Miette Hot Springs is the perfect place to soothe sore muscles after a scenic walk or hike on the Sulphur Skyline trail.
