### Planning your trip...

- The two parks are extremely busy in July and August. Make sure the Parks Canada Visitor Centre in Tobermory is your first stop to get real-time information on parking and attractions.
- There are many great sites along the entire peninsula. Visit www. explorethebruce.com to check out all the great destinations along the peninsula or consider visiting in the spring or fall to avoid the crowds.
- Some trails in the park are challenging, particularly along the Georgian Bay shoreline. We recommend wearing hiking boots or sturdy shoes and hike within your ability.
- Help us keep your park clean.
   Please use garbage receptacles where provided and carry out your garbage when visiting Indian Head Cove and Flowerpot Island.
- Although it looks tropical, the water along the Georgian Bay shoreline is very cold and often rough. Check water conditions before entering the water; swim within your ability; and remember cliff jumping is an illegal activity in the park.
- The two parks are home to countless animals and plants, many of them rare and endangered. By remaining on the trails and not removing any items, you'll be helping to keep yourself safe and keep your park protected.

From here prepare to dive deep into the world of Fathom Five. 24 shipwrecks, great diving and snorkelling and scenic Flowerpot Island.

Or, plan your trip to explore the Bruce Peninsula National Park in the heart of the Niagara Escarpment World Biosphere Reserve. This National Park protects the largest continuous tract of forest in Southern Ontario. Home to 44 species of orchids, unique and rare plants and animals, breathtaking geological formations and I'll bet you've never seen a starry night sky like this before. Adventure at your doorstep!
