Canada's highest mountains, surrounded by huge expanses of icefields and glaciers are found deep in the interior of the park.

A different landscape forms where the glaciers melt. This landscape is filled with mountains, valleys, forests and rivers. Habitats found here are home to an array of plants and animals ranging from lichens and lupines to ground squirrels and grizzlies.

The Southern Tutchone people have lived as part of this place for generations and continue to hunt and gather what this land provides.





Kluane is a place to choose your own adventure – be that a multiday hike to the toe of a glacier, a day stroll along a lake shore, flightseeing high above the tall mountains, or a long-planned-for rafting or mountaineering expedition.



Here you can enjoy a wander along the beach, a picnic in the shelter, a climb up a mountain, and if the wind cooperates, a paddle on the lake. Learn about the kokanee salmon that live here, and perhaps get a glimpse of distant high peaks. At the end of the day, pitch your tent at the campground, cook dinner over a campfire and enjoy the long daylight hours.

The Visitor Centres are a must-see for those wanting to learn more about the natural and cultural history of Kluane. Jump on a scale to see how many bear cubs you weigh, listen to a native legend, or watch a HD video at the Kluane National Park and Reserve Visitor Centre. Learn about Dall's sheep and feel the glacial winds that blow down the valley while you peer through the scope on the deck of the Thachal Dhal Visitor Centre. At either
