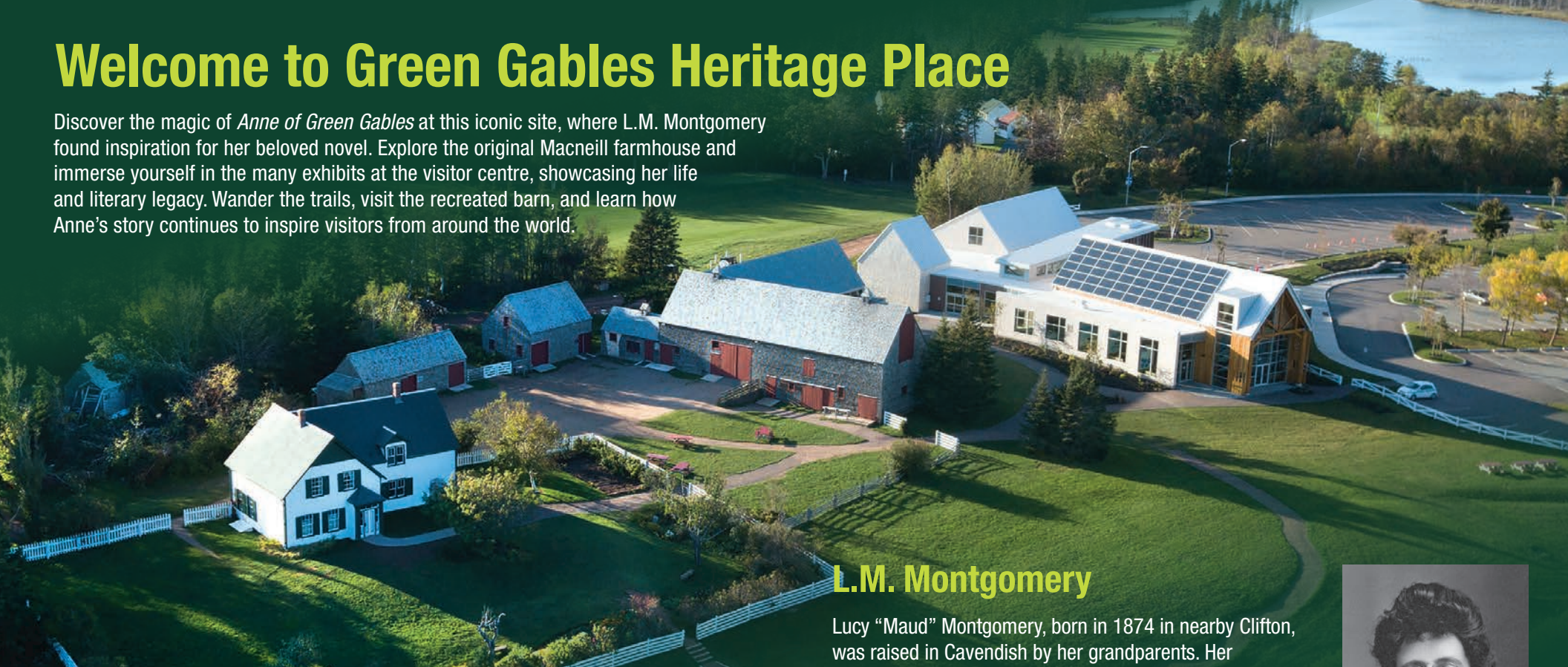

Welcome to Green Gables Heritage Place

Discover the magic of *Anne of Green Gables* at this iconic site, where L.M. Montgomery found inspiration for her beloved novel. Explore the original Macneill farmhouse and immerse yourself in the many exhibits at the visitor centre, showcasing her life and literary legacy. Wander the trails, visit the recreated barn, and learn how Anne's story continues to inspire visitors from around the world.



L.M. Montgomery

Lucy "Maud" Montgomery, born in 1874 in nearby Clifton, was raised in Cavendish by her grandparents. Her writing, influenced by the landscapes and community around her, began early in her life. *Anne of Green Gables* was published in 1908 and became an instant success, marking the start of Montgomery's extensive literary career. By her passing in 1942, she had published 20 novels and hundreds of short stories and poems, leaving a rich legacy that continues to inspire new adaptations.



Green Gables House

Green Gables House was once the home of the Macneill family, cousins of L.M. Montgomery. While Montgomery did not live here, she spent much of her childhood nearby and visited the Macneill farmhouse frequently. This property inspired the setting of *Anne of Green Gables*, where Montgomery imagined her beloved character, Anne Shirley, finding her home.



Although the house is not the real home of the fictional characters Anne, Marilla, and Matthew, it is a faithful representation of what Anne's world might have looked like. The décor inside is based on the descriptions found in the novel, creating a space that feels as though Anne could have lived here.

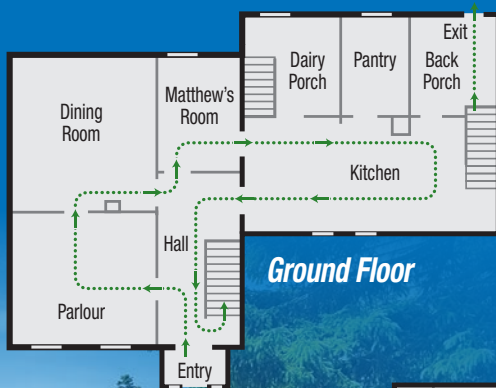

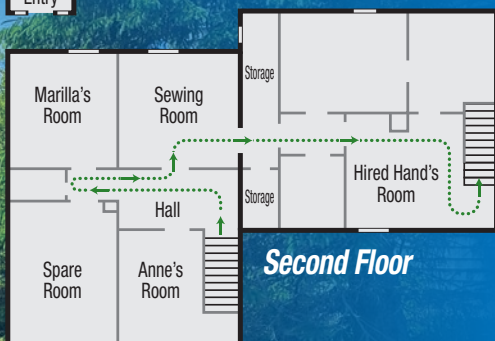

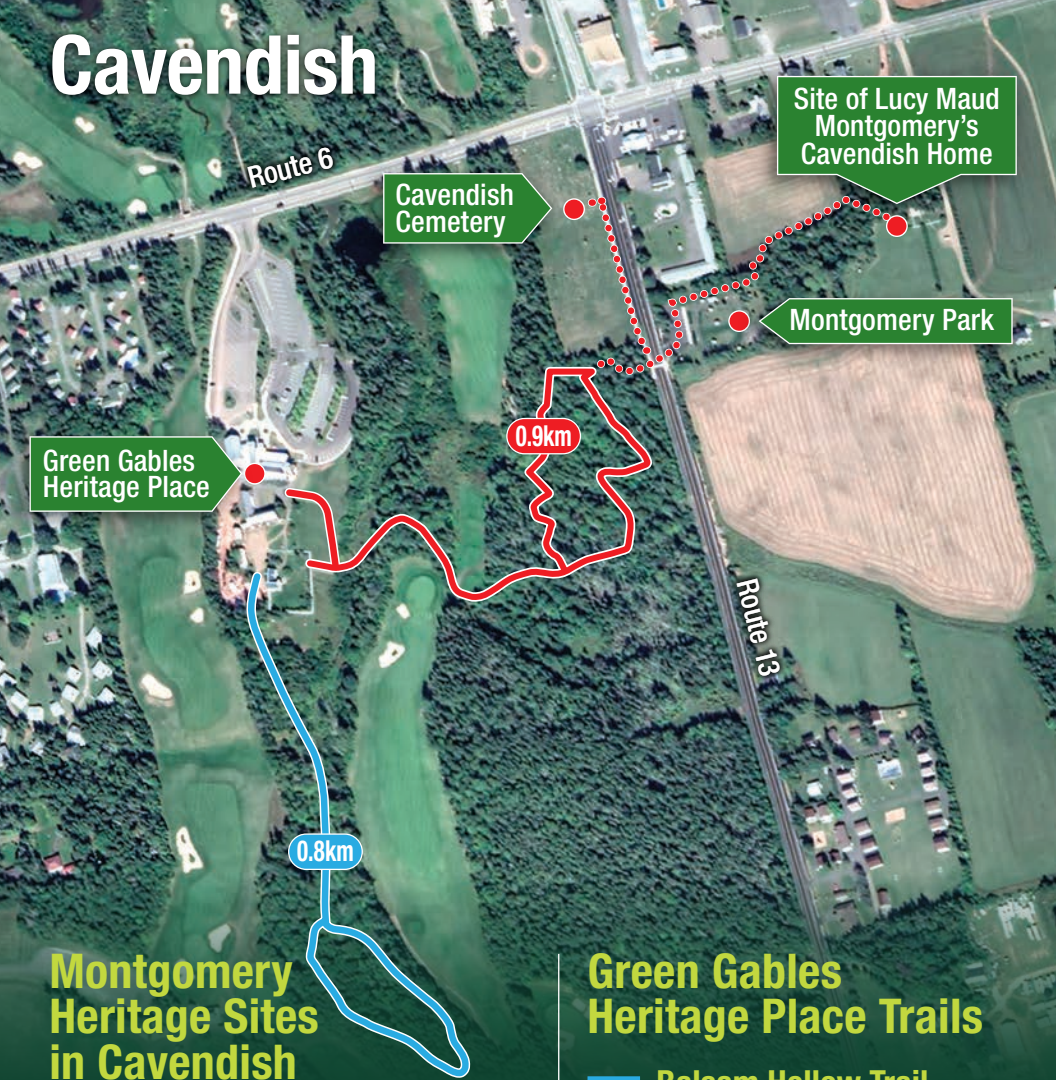

Montgomery Heritage Sites in Cavendish

Cavendish Cemetery

Final resting place of L.M. Montgomery (Macdonald).

Site of L.M. Montgomery's Cavendish Home

Restored foundation of Montgomery's childhood home, bookshop, and walking trail. Privately operated. Admission pass available for purchase at Green Gables Visitor Centre.

Montgomery Park

Starting point for "The Inspiring World of L.M. Montgomery" Literary Tour and home to the bronze statue of the author, "A Glimpse of Beauty". (Not administered by Parks Canada.)

Green Gables Heritage Place Trails

Balsam Hollow Trail

0.8km, Loop

Packed gravel; gently rolling with some exposed roots. Includes some stairs. Includes "Lover's Lane".

Haunted Wood Trail

0.9km, Loop

Packed gravel; gently rolling with some exposed roots. Includes some stairs.

Route to Other Sites

Path leading to the cemetery, Montgomery Park and the Site of L.M. Montgomery's Cavendish Home.
