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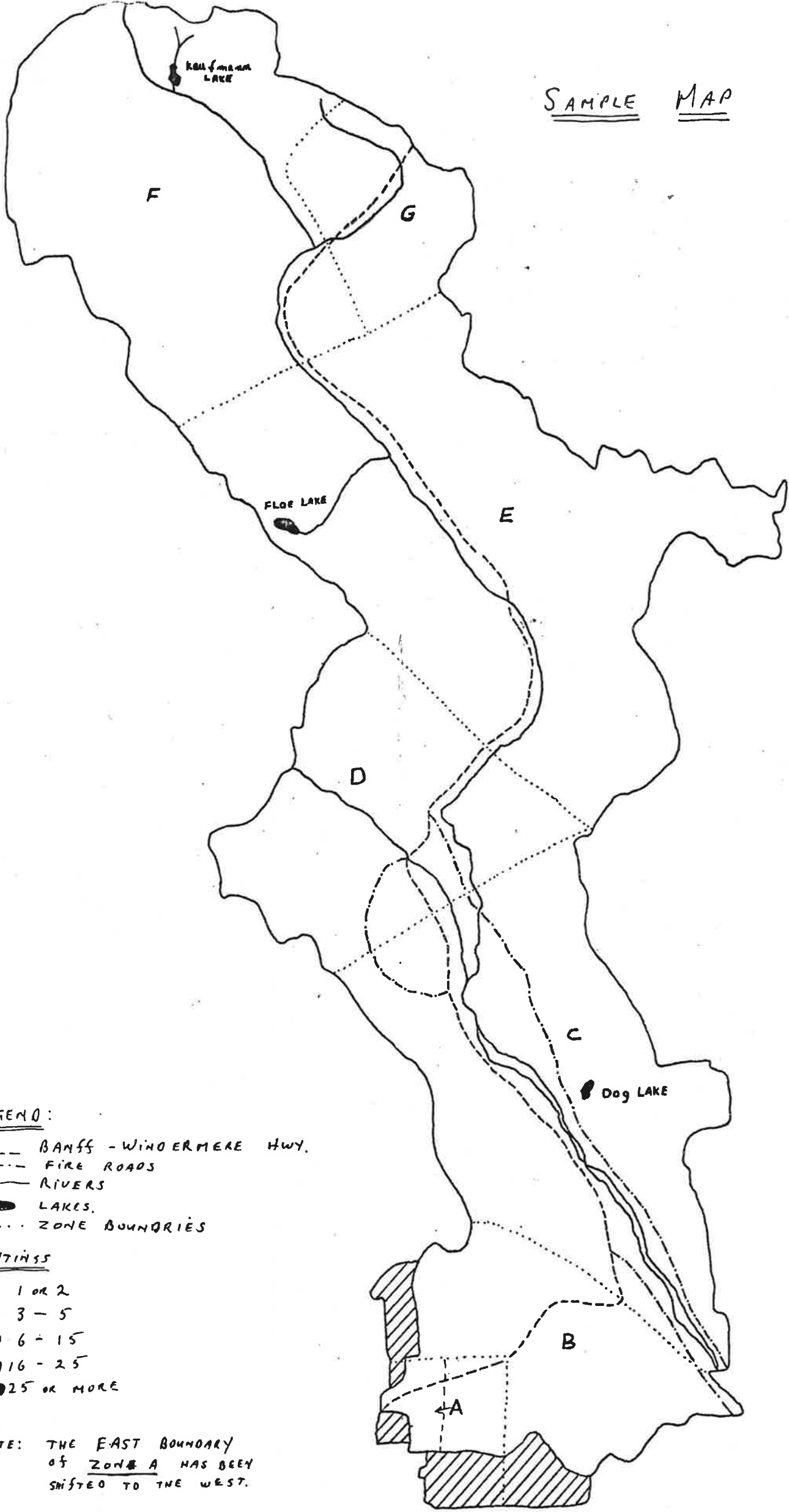
Conclusion: It is realised that the following record is far from perfect and we apologise for any errors or internal inconsistencies that become evident. While this project was primarily concerned with consolidating and collating existing field data, it was also a learning experience for us. In the process of completing the project, possible improvements in some of our methods became evident and were, in many cases, incorporated. For this reason, and for other more obvious reasons, it is suggested that this record become the responsibility of one seasonal naturalist each year and that he familiarise himself with it, make every effort to keep it accurate and up-to-date, and, where necessary, that he refine the techniques of recording.

It is our hope that by maintaining this record, in time, an accurate and fairly complete picture of nature and dynamics of the park's bird population will emerge.
