ROUTE	Distance	Type	Description
 Pines	0.9 km	Loop	Part of the Acadian forest where you'll see majestic white pines.
 Beaver	1.4 km	Loop	Discover how a swamp forest is reclaiming a site abandoned by beavers.
 Mi'gmaq – Cedar	0.9 km	Loop	Long wooden boardwalks allow visitors to explore the cedar swamp.
 Salt Marsh	0.9 km	Loop	Discover the cordgrass' special adaptations and keep an eye out for all sorts of birds.
 Kellys Beach Boardwalk	1 km return	Linear	See the evolution of the dunes and the important role of several species.
 Bog	1.8 km return	Linear	Enjoy a spiral staircase tower view and observe carnivorous plants and mosses.
 Kouchibouguac River	11.3 km	Linear	Admire the spectacular sandstone rock formations.
 Osprey	5.3 km	Loop	Get to the end of the trail to experience an outstanding view. Ospreys and bald eagles can sometimes be seen diving for fish.
 Claire-Fontaine	3.3 km	Loop	Follow Rankin Brook, Black River and the Kouchibouguac Lagoon. In the fall, several waterfowl species can be spotted.

CYCLING

ROUTE	Distance	Type	Description
 Major Kollock Creek	6.3 km	Linear, one-way, mountain biking.	Ideal for visitors who want to try mountain biking. The remains of old beaver colonies are visible along the trail and moose are often seen in the area.
 Biking trail network	60 km	Linear or loop	Pedal along well-maintained gravel-topped trails that lead past striking fields of wildflowers, multifaceted peat and grand Acadian woodland.

 **Pedal assist e-bikes** are permitted on all areas where pedal bikes are allowed. The throttle can only be used on roadways and is prohibited on trails.

SAFETY AND GUIDELINES

When visiting Kouchibouguac National Park, you are responsible for your own safety. Make sure to:

- **Plan your route**, check the weather, and know the terrain before leaving. Stick to designated trails.
- **Share your itinerary** with a friend or family member. If you get lost, stay calm and stay put. This helps Search and Rescue teams in an emergency.
- **Refrain from using inflatables** in the water.
- Only consume alcohol and/or cannabis **inside your registered campsite**.
- Remember **it is illegal to collect** plants, animals, fossils, rocks, or any natural or historic item.
- Leave your drone at home. **Drones are not permitted** at Parks Canada sites.

YOU AND YOUR PETS



- Enjoy pet-friendly areas like **trails, picnic spots**, and **Callanders beach**.
- Keep your pet **on a leash** at all times.
- **Clean up** after your pet and **dispose of waste** properly.



- Bring pets to **barrier island dunes**, including **Kellys Beach** and its **access boardwalk**.
- Allow pets to **disturb wildlife**, especially nesting birds and young animals.
- Let your pet roam **off-leash**.

RESPECT WILDLIFE



Did you know that feeding wildlife can lead to disease, dependence, and even death? Remember, wild animals must stay wild!



- **Store all food items** in your car, RV, or a hard-sided vehicle.
- Keep your **picnic site clean**.
- **Respect fenced/closed areas** protecting nesting sites and vegetation.



- **Leave food unattended**, not even a minute!
- **Feed wildlife**.
- **Litter**. Keep a clean picnic site.
