L'île aux Perroquets

With an incredible panoramic view of the surrounding waters, this is the perfect place for bird watching and observing marine mammals. The island's lighthouse has been run by some of the region's most noteworthy historical figures.



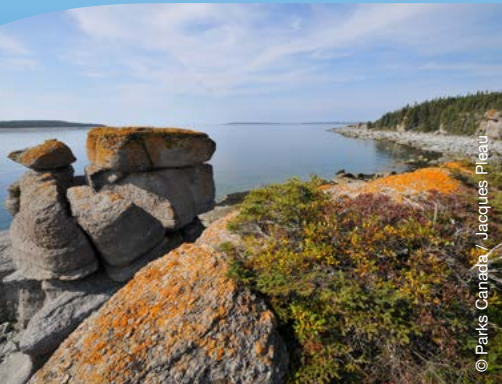
L'île Quarry

A visit to the heart of the island will lead you from one habitat to the next, revealing among other landscapes, fascinating inland cliffs. The Pots de fleurs (flowerpots) monoliths are sure to take your breath away.



La Petite île au Marteau

Witness to a time past, the light station adds charm and character to this unique environment. The island provides easy access for hiking, picnicking and relaxation, whether you are alone, with your family or in a group. You can also observe seabirds, ice-wedge polygons, fossils and beautiful cliffs. Nature and culture are yours to discover.



L'île Nue de Mingan

A seemingly desolate landscape is actually one of the most intriguing, an extremely fragile environment called the barrens. Arctic-alpine plants, seabirds, monoliths and fossils abound on this island.

La Grande Île

This island will spellbind the nature-lover looking for an escape. Peace and tranquility await. Impressive monoliths rise up at the sea's edge: the "Château" (castle), right out of a fairy tale, and a "Zoo" of ancient stone animals, standing strong through the millennia.

L'île Niapiskau

Here resides the majestic "Madame de Niapisca", named by the poet Roland Jomphe. This stunning limestone giant and the surrounding monoliths are nothing short of awe-inspiring. You'll doubtless want to know more about the origins of these unusual sculptures.

L'île du Fantôme

Discover a diversity of flora along the trail. You'll be mesmerized by the rounded monoliths, checkered reef flats and marine life commonly seen skirting the shores of this island.

L'île du Havre

Less than a kilometre offshore from Havre-Saint-Pierre, this island is an initiation into the unique universe of the archipelago. A walk around its perimeter offers a close look at its tall sculpted cliffs and its varied shoreline of long beaches and fossil rich flats.

L'île de la Fausse Passe

Guaranteed to impress, this island's monoliths differ from the others'. Eroded into distinct layers, the monoliths and cliffs are rich in fossils.

L'île à la Chasse

Rarely visited due to its remoteness, this island offers visitors an experience inspired by the life of Count Henry de Puyjalon. Naturalist extraordinaire, he wrote several works and lived there as a hermit for five years, until his death in 1905. A cross was erected in his honour.

Eastern Islands and Islets

These rose-coloured islands and islets can be seen from viewpoints at Baie Pontbriand and Rivière Corneille. This exceptional area is a preferred nesting site for seabirds and home to the largest migratory bird sanctuary in Quebec.
