


- Use the **designated trails** and stay in the vegetation-free zone when walking on the seashore.
- Avoid disturbing wildlife and be sure to leave natural objects such as rocks, plants, and fossils where you found them.
- Be attentive and keep your distance from seabirds and shorebirds; they are particularly vulnerable to disturbance.


- The island was once called **Sea Cow Island** or **île de la Vache marine** after the walruses and seals that lived there. Locals call the seals sea wolves because of the sounds they make.
- Today, you can still see **haulouts** where they congregate and rest in the shallow waters exposed at low tide
- On the west coast of the island, you can admire magnificent intricately carved cliffs. This rocky landscape has been carved and smoothed by the sea.
- Black guillemots seabirds sometimes known locally as **pigeon de mer** - nest in the crevices of cliffs.

For your safety

Checklist

Allow 1 1/2 to 2 hours to go around the island. To ensure a pleasant visit, don't forget:
