Pacific Rim National Park How to Get There

Pacific swells hurl themselves against craggy headlands or roll up wide sandy beaches in this spectacular new (1971) national park on Vancouver Island's west coast.

Pacific Rim National Park is in three units: Long Beach, the Broken Group Islands and the West Coast Trail. Each unit is separated from the others by expanses of land and water, and each is reached by visitors in a different way.

Long Beach, the most heavily visited and developed segment, is accessible from Port Alberni on a winding, paved mountain highway. Visitor facilities and services include campgrounds, day-use areas adjacent to major beaches and, from late June to September, a free interpretive program. This program consists of conducted walks and audio-visual and evening presentations. The local fishing communities of Tofino (population 612) and Ucluelet (population 1300) offer visitors a wide choice of motel and hotel units as well as private campgrounds. All other usual tourist services are available in or near the two villages.

The Broken Group Islands — about 100 in all — are at the entrance to Barkley Sound and may be reached by boat from Ucluelet and Port Alberni. Several primitive campsites have been provided on the islands and small boat travel is possible in waters sheltered within the

The West Coast Trail lies between Bamfield and Port Renfrew — a distance of 72 km. It can only be travelled on foot and demands all the strength and stamina hikers can muster along its rugged and often rain-soaked length. Bamfield is reached from Port Alberni along a good gravel road, and Port Renfrew can be reached by road from Victoria or

Detailed information about the park may be obtained in summer at the information centre near the entrance to the Long Beach Unit and all year at the park office in the Long Beach Unit.
