Sought out by visitors for decades for its beautiful sandy beaches, Cavendish has become famous around the world for its connections to author L.M. Montgomery and her stories about Anne Shirley, the spunky, red-headed heroine

of *'Anne of Green Gables'*. A favourite stop for visitors all summer long, Cavendish offers not only the beautiful beach but also some of the best views around of the signature rugged, red sandstone cliffs of PEI's North Shore.

Hike & Bike

1 Homestead Trail

Stacked loop with 2 routes - 6.3 or 8.4 km, return. Suitable for hikers or cyclists. Passes through forest and farmland along the shores of New London Bay. Best for hybrid or mountain bikes.

2 Cavendish Dunelands

2.3 km, one-way. Stunning views of sand dunes and freshwater ponds. Links with the Homestead Trail and Gulf Shore Way. Suitable for most bikes.

3 Clarks Lane

1.2 km, one-way. Starts at Cavendish Grove and connects with Cavendish Dunelands and Cavendish Beach trails. Suitable for most bikes.

4 Cavendish Beach Trail

1.1 km, one-way. Passes through a sugar maple stand before reaching Cavendish Beach and connecting with Cavendish Dunelands trail. Suitable for most bikes.

5 Balsam Hollow

0.8 km, return. Part of Green Gables, this trail begins with Lover's Lane and wanders through woodlands and follows a brook. Green Gables Heritage Place entry fees apply.

6 Haunted Wood

0.9 km, one-way. Located at Green Gables, this wooded area served as the inspiration for the Haunted Wood that appeared in *Anne of Green Gables*. Green Gables Heritage Place entry fees apply. Passes near the Cavendish Cemetery, resting place of L.M. Montgomery, and connects to Site of L.M. Montgomery's Cavendish Home (separate entry fee or combination pass required).

7 Gulf Shore Way

8.5 km, one-way. Trailheads at Oceanview Lookoff and North Rustico park entry gate. Paved, multi-use trail skirting the top of the red sandstone cliffs with magnificent views of Gulf of St. Lawrence. Suitable for most bikes.

Oceanview Lookoff

The name says it all! Bring your camera and capture some breathtaking views with your lens. Parking, picnic area, observation platform and access to Cavendish Dunelands Trail & Gulf Shore Way.

Cavendish Grove

Beautiful picnic area suitable for groups of all sizes. Trailheads for Cavendish Beach Trail, Clarks Lane & Cavendish Dunelands. Signage along the trails highlights natural & cultural heritage of the area.

Green Gables Heritage Place

Part of Lucy Maud Montgomery's Cavendish National Historic Site. Features the original farmhouse that inspired setting of *Anne of Green Gables*, exhibits, short film about the author's life & more! Gift shop & snack bar available June-September. Family-friendly programming in July/August. See p. 21 for more information.

Site of L.M. Montgomery's Cavendish Home

Part of Lucy Maud Montgomery's Cavendish National Historic Site. Features the restored foundation of the author's homestead, bookshop and walking trail with signage detailing site history. Privately operated; combination pass available granting the holder admission to both this site and Green Gables.

Green Gables Golf Course

Privately operated 18-hole golf course. Dining services available.

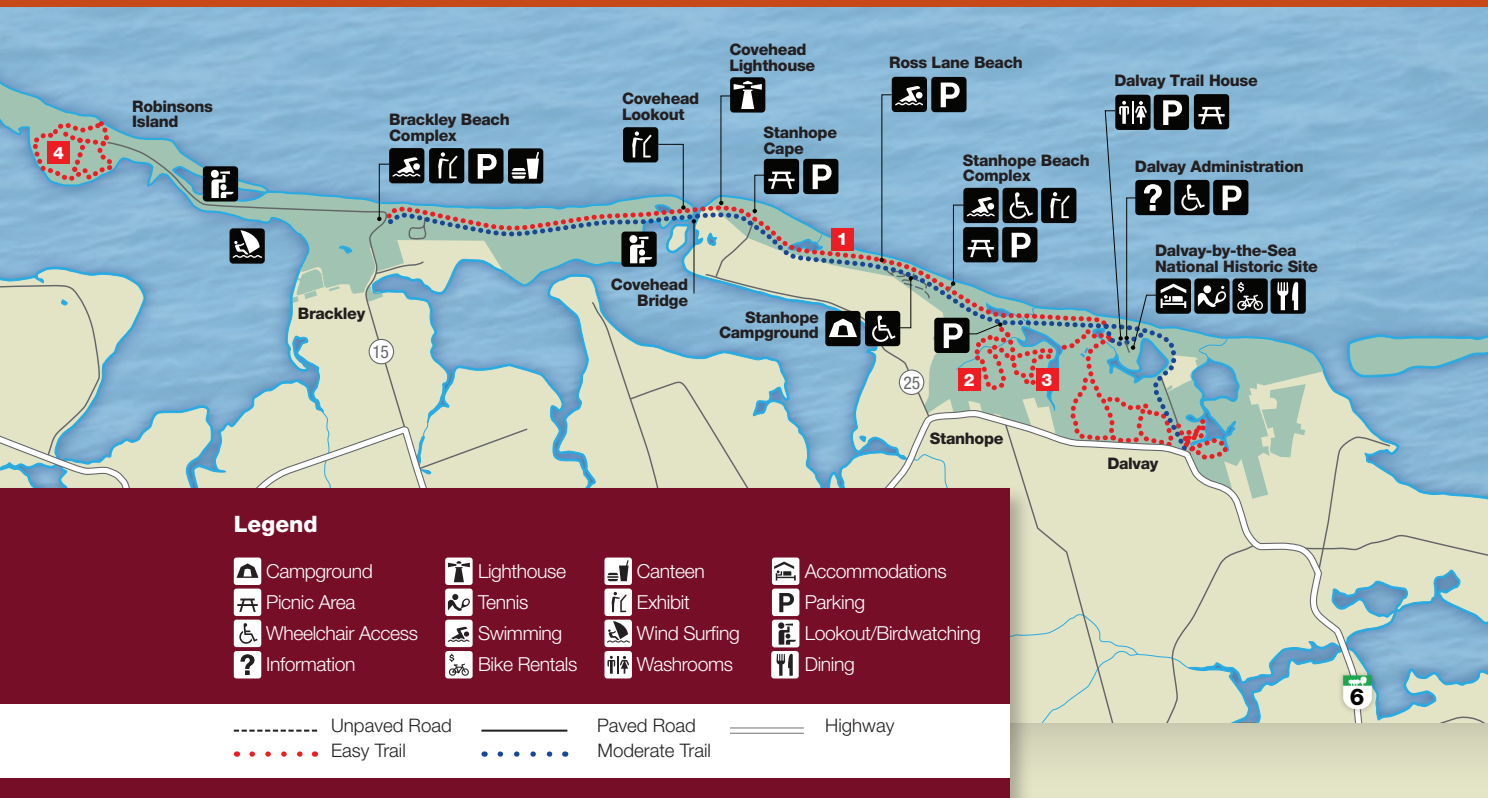
North Rustico Beach

Open June 14 to September 15. Supervised from June 30 - August 23. Washroom facilities and parking area.

BRACKLEY-DALVAY MAP

Beautiful Brackley Beach is a popular summer destination for many local Island beach-goers for its white sand and its proximity to Charlottetown. This region also has many lovely smaller beaches which often do not see nearly as much traffic as the larger ones. Keep this in mind if you

like a quieter place for your beach day! Covehead Harbour, Covehead Lighthouse and Dalvy-by-the-Sea National Historic Site are also must-see stops along this pretty stretch of coastline. And be sure to check out the new multi-use trail system at Robinsons Island!



Hike & Bike

1 Gulf Shore Way

10 km, one-way. Stretching from Brackley to Dalvy, this paved, multi-use trail is perfect for walking, jogging or cycling. Take in the beautiful views of sand dunes, salt marshes and forests from a whole new point-of-view! Suitable for all bikes.

2 Farmlands

2.7 km, return. A path taking you along fields, hedgerows and mixed woodlands, part of this trail was once a road – the oldest road in PEI! Hybrid or mountain bikes recommended.

3 Bubbling Springs

2.2 km, return. A favourite among birdwatchers, this path has lookouts that offer great views of waterfowl at Long Pond. Hybrid or mountain bikes recommended.

4 R.I.T.S. (Robinsons Island Trail System)

Stacked loop with 5 km of trail & 11 optional technical features. Suitable for beginner to intermediate mountain bikers. Picnic area, observation stations and beach access. See page 15 for more information.

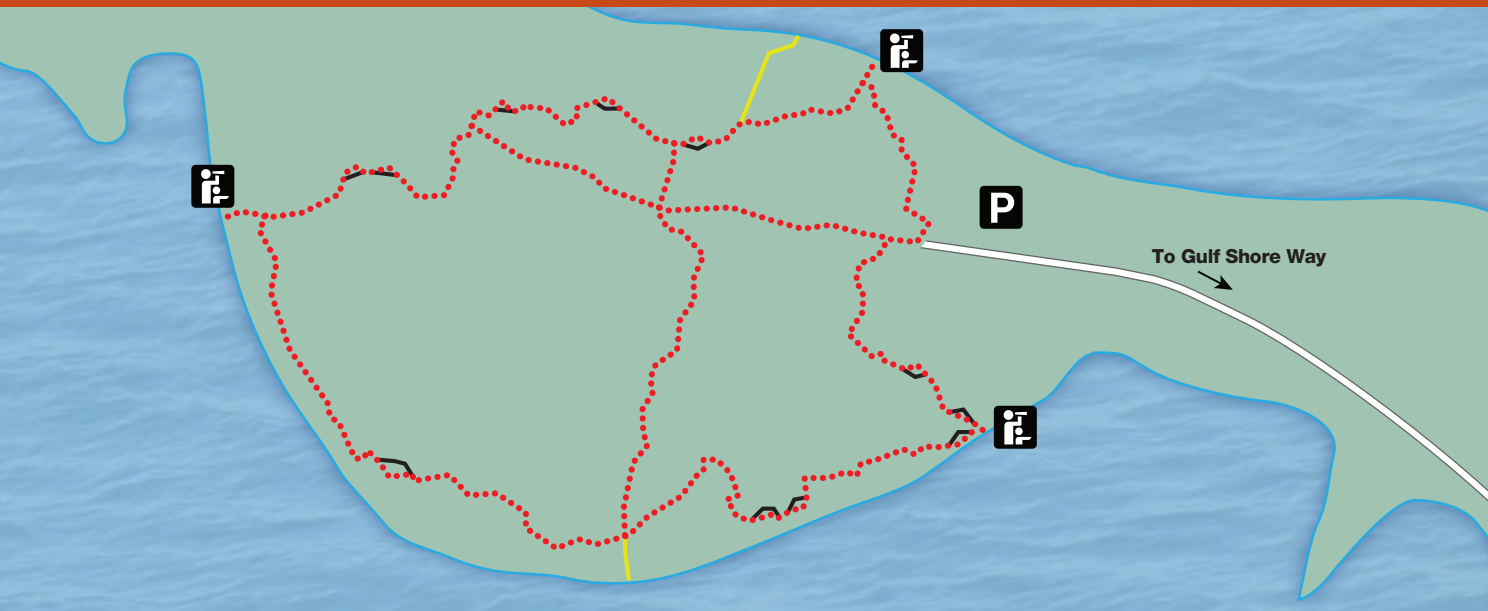

R.I.T.S. – ROBINSONS ISLAND TRAIL SYSTEM MAP

Prince Edward Island National Park is putting on the R.I.T.S.! Welcome to the Robinsons Island Trail System, also known as the “R.I.T.S.,” - 5 kilometers of multi-use trail and the newest addition to the park’s outdoor offer. Located on a small island that was once home to a popular campground, this family-friendly trail has options for hikers and bikers of all levels. Designed as a “stacked loop,” explorers can choose a shorter or longer route depending on skill level or time constraints.

The trail has been designed with mountain bikers in mind and features 11 technical trail challenges located in spurs that break off of the main trail. An afternoon at the R.I.T.S. is an outdoor adventure meant to challenge beginner to intermediate mountain bikers, but those who dare not test their skills on the ramps and teeter totters need not shy away; just skip the branches and stick to the main trail for a beautifully scenic cycling adventure.



Please note: Cycling Helmets are mandatory on Prince Edward Island.

GREENWICH MAP

Home to the biggest sand dunes on Prince Edward Island, Greenwich has a long history with connections to Mi'kmaq and Acadian culture and an ever-evolving tale of the shaping and re-shaping of its landscapes through wind and wave.

The path to Greenwich may be a bit less traveled than other areas of PEI National Park but it's ripe for discovery through exploration of its trails, beach and beautiful interpretation centre.



Hike and Bike

1 Tlaqatik

4.8 km, return. Experience the history of the area and the story of human interaction with the land over time as you journey along the edges of St. Peters Bay. Hybrid or mountain bikes recommended.

2 Greenwich Dunes

4.8 km, return. Travel across homestead fields, through a forest stand and over Bowley Pond on a floating boardwalk as you journey toward your first sight of the majestic Greenwich Dunes. Only part of this trail can be explored by bike. You can travel as far as the junction with the Tlaqatik Trail and then the rest must be done on foot. Bike locks are available to borrow at the Greenwich Interpretation Centre.

3 Havre Saint Pierre

1.1 km, return. This short trail takes you along the shores of beautiful St. Peters Bay. The flat, natural surface trail is partially wheelchair accessible. Hybrid or mountain bikes recommended.

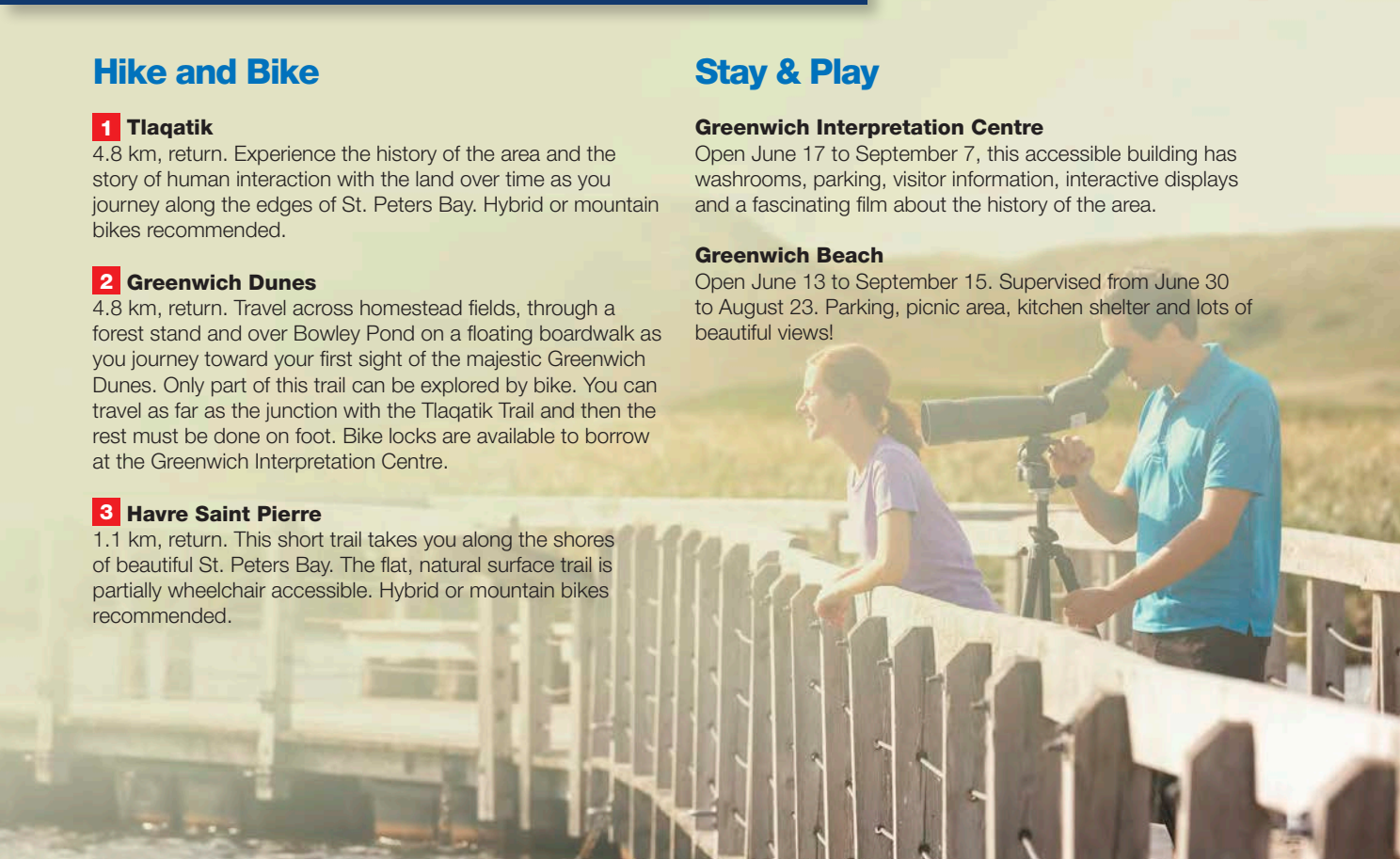

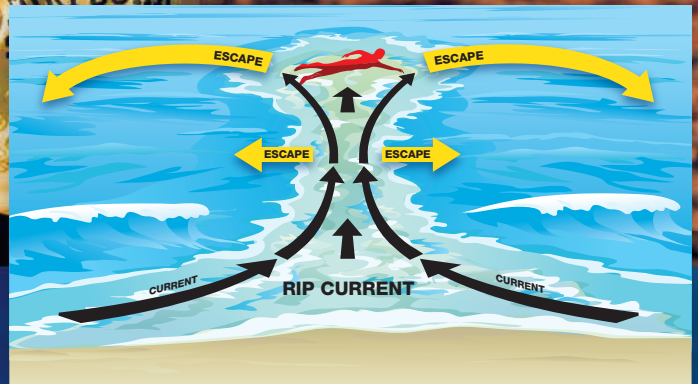

Rip Current Safety

Learn how to “*Break the Grip of the Rip*”

Rip currents are powerful, fast-moving seaward currents that can pull even the strongest swimmers out to sea.

Be safe: Know how to swim, never swim alone, and when in doubt, don't go out.

If you become caught in a rip current:

- *Don't fight the current*
- *Swim out of the current, then to shore*
- *If you can't escape, float or tread water*
- *If you need help, call or wave for assistance*

Parks Canada and its service providers make every reasonable effort to mark areas that are known to have rip currents; however, there may be other such areas that are not marked.

Help Protect the Sand Dunes: Walk & Play Elsewhere

The waving blades of marram grass play an important role. Their roots form a living net that slows the movement of blowing sand and helps with the formation of the dunes. Marram grass is killed with only 10 footsteps. When the grass is gone, the sand is free to move around, which causes blowouts and makes the dunes more susceptible to erosion from storms.

Do your part to keep the dunes as beautiful tomorrow as they are today: stick to designated paths and remind your friends and family of the damage they can cause by climbing or walking on the dunes.



Step into the Story at **GREEN GABLES HERITAGE PLACE!**

Take a walk through the setting of Canada's bestselling novel of all time, *Anne of Green Gables*! Written by Island author L.M. Montgomery, *Anne of Green Gables* has never been out of print since it was first published more than 100 years ago. The tale of a spunky, redheaded orphan who comes to live with an elderly brother and sister at their family home called "Green Gables", the book has found its way into the hearts of millions of readers the world over. Today, fans of the book flock to Green Gables to immerse themselves in the storybook landscape, find the source of Montgomery's inspiration, and fulfill a lifelong dream of seeing the places they read about firsthand.

Begin your visit with a short film about Montgomery's experiences in Cavendish and explore the many exhibits in the Visitors Centre, including early editions of the novel as well as the very typewriter she used to craft her literary masterpieces. Then, step outside and walk back in time to explore the imaginary world of Anne.

The house and grounds have been lovingly restored and decorated in exquisite detail to match the world Montgomery described. Retrace Montgomery's footsteps down beautiful Lover's Lane, bravely venture down the path of the Haunted Wood and don't miss the chance to take part in the fun programs offered throughout the summer months that are sure to appeal to "kindred spirits" of all ages. Finally, no visit to Green Gables would be complete without a stop at the Butter Churn Café for a delicious treat and a bottle of raspberry cordial – an "excruciatingly delightful" way to end the day, as Anne might say!
