GUIDED SCHOOL EXPERIENCES



GRASSLAND SAFARI

grades 4-6

Students use simple monitoring techniques to study the soil, plants, insects and animals of the Manitoba prairie. They will explore the diversity of remnant fescue grasslands in Riding Mountain National Park and recognize the endangered status of grasslands in Canada and around the world.

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$4.90 per student

DISCOVERING THE FOREST

grades K-2

Using their five senses throughout this program, students discover some of the plants and animals that make the forest their home. The sights, sounds, and smells of Riding Mountain National Park come alive with the help of teachers, group leaders, and is guided by a park interpreter. *This program requires an adult for every 5 students

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$4.90 per student

BOREAL EXPLORER

grades 3-6

Spruce trees, wolves, moose and fire are all part of the "northern" or Boreal forest. Students will explore the extreme interactions within this forest community. The program will develop knowledge, skills and student commitment to responsible behaviours and actions concerning boreal forests.

SCHOOL EXPERIENCES CONTINUED...

ESCARPMENT ODYSSEY

grades 5-8

Students will be guided on a rugged and spectacular 6km hike down the Gorge Creek Trail - an experience not easily forgotten! Awareness and knowledge will be developed concerning the geology, history, flora and fauna of the Manitoba Escarpment in Riding Mountain National Park.

Length: 3 hours Fee: \$4.90 per student *4 1/2 hours with travel time from Wasagaming

BISON BOOTCAMP

grades 6-8

March to the command of the Queen of the Herd Bison Sergeant, roam into the world of bison and ruminate about intricate connections to First Nations and the health of our grasslands. Includes bannock making, tea sampling. * *Allergy alert* *

This program takes place at Lake Audy Bison Enclosure which is an additional 45 min drive from Wasgaming

Length: 3 hours Fee: \$4.90 per student *4 1/2 hours with travel time from Wasagaming

THE WOLVES AND ELK OF THE RIDNG MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK REGION

grades 9-12

Riding Mountain National Park Interpreters guide groups through a field program in the Lake Audy area of the Park. Students use menthods in research and monitoring wolves and elk such as radio telemetry. This program takes place at Lake Audy Bison Enclosure, which is a 45 minute drive from Wasagaming.

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$4.90 per student *3.5 hours with travel time from Wasagaming

THE BEAVERS OF THE RIDING MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK REGION

grades 9-12

In the field students will monitor and learn about the diversity that these "ecosystem engineers" provide to the surrounding landscape and some of the issues facing management of wild and not so wild spaces.

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$4.90 per student

VISITOR CENTRE TOUR

all ages

Length: 30 minutes Fee: \$1.00 per student

HUG A TREE AND SURVIVE

grades k-2

This is an AdventureSmart program that helps lost children survive in the woods. It teaches children how not to become lost in the woods, and what to do should they become lost.

Length: 30 minutes Fee: Free when added to a paid program

PLANT A WILD FLOWER

grades K-3

Enlighten students in a fun hands on way about biodiversity and the importance of native species of plants for wildlife and for us. Plant a wildflower, make wildflower seed bombs, create plant pounding art or include a wildflower drawing lesson.

Length: 1 hour Fee: \$4.00 per student

UNEARTHING THE PAST

grades 3-6

The clues to Manitoba's precontact period lay just beneath our feet! Examining real artifacts unearthed from archaeological sites in Manitoba, students will discover how bones, stones and pottery are puzzle pieces used by archaeologists to understand our past. Using precontact methods, students will make and take home their own replica Laurel or Blackduck pot.

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$6 per student

SPECIES AT RISK: BATS IN THE BIOSPHERE grades 5-8

Bats are more than just scary creatures of the night. They play an important role in our ecosystems. Unfortunately, many of our bat species are currently in decline because of White Nose Syndrome. Through awareness and understanding, we can all play an active role in the protection of Manitoba's bats and those the live in the Riding Mountain Biosphere Reserve region.

Length: 1 hour Fee: \$3.00 per student

BONES AND STONES

grades 5-8

Knowing how to flint knap and throw an atlatl were just two of the skills needed to survive in Manitoba thousands of year ago. In this program, students will examine the bones and stones recovered from archaeological sites and learn how hunting techniques changed over time. Students will be able to try their hand at flint knapping and learn how to throw an atlatl.

Length: 2 hour Fee: \$4.00 per student

LIVING BY THE WATER'S EDGE

grades 6-8

The water's edge is a busy place. Animals, birds, bugs and humans all required healthy lakes and rivers to survive. But did you know that everything is connected in a watershed? What happens in one area affects the health of another area! Learn about our roles and responsibilities in maintaining our waterways and help us ensure our waters stay healthy for future generations.

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$4.00 per student

"CACHING" RIDING MOUNTAIN

all ages

This program showcases GPS technology and the activity of Geocaching as a means of participating in innovative learning. GPS & Geocaching programs are flexible to suit the needs of the groups. Basic, intermediate and advanced programs available.

MARSH MARVELS

grades K-3

Follow the floating boardwalk through Ominnik marsh; students will have the chance to see what lives in this water wonderland. Wetland dip netting and critter identification are just some of the possible activities. Program emphasis is on the value of wetlands for wildlife and people.

Length: 2 hours Fee: \$4.50 per student
