Wasagaming Campground offers an exceptional camping opportunity for celebrating nature & exploring Riding Mountain National Park. We hope you enjoy your camping experience in this special place!

CAMPING INFORMATION

Check-in anytime after 2:00 p.m.

Check-out or re-register prior to 11:00 a.m. Camping space is in constant demand and unregistered campers will be asked to vacate.

You must notify the attendants of **cancellations** at the registration kiosk before 11:00 a.m. on the day you wish to depart to be eligible for a refund.

Quiet hours are from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Visitors are not permitted and generators to be turned off during this time.

Campground gates are closed to vehicles from 1:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.

Bundled firewood may be purchased from our wood yard (cash transactions only), or you may purchase tokens from the campground kiosk with cash, credit or debit cards. Bringing firewood from other areas into Riding Mountain National Park is not permitted; it may harbour invasive species invasive species that have the potential to destroy entire forests.

All water in Wasagaming Campground is potable.

Join us for a **Campfire Interpretive Program** during your stay! Ask kiosk staff for more information on activities and events taking place in the campground and throughout Riding Mountain National Park.

REGULATIONS

Alcohol consumption is prohibited nightly from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. There is a complete alcohol ban in effect for the entire May Long Weekend.

Each site is allowed a **maximum** of 2 tents or 1 tent and a wheeled camping unit.

A maximum of 6 people and 2 vehicles are allowed per campsite.

In order to help preserve the natural environment, all camping equipment must stay within existing impacted areas. It is illegal to collect deadfall for firewood, or cut down any brush, branches or trees within Riding Mountain National Park.

Noise shall be kept to a minimum at all times.

Fires are permitted only in designated fire places. **Never leave a fire unattended.** Campfires and major light sources must be extinguished by 1:00 a.m.

Pets must be kept leashed at all times and cannot be left unattended. Respect others by cleaning up after your pets and keeping noise levels to a minimum.

Fireworks are not permitted. Persons using or in possession of fireworks are subject to federal prosecution.

The **registered permit holder shall ensure** that nothing done by themselves or visitors using their site will interfere with the quiet, peaceful use and enjoyment of Riding Mountain National Park by any other person.

This includes damaging property, loud music, insulting or obscene language, drunkenness, fighting, screaming, etc.

Failure to comply with these or any other regulations in effect within Riding Mountain National Park may result in the cancellation of the camping permit, prosecution and/or eviction. When a permit is cancelled, no refund will be given for the unused portion of the camping permit.

BEAR-PROOF YOUR CAMPSITE

Store all food, coolers, cooking utensils and toiletries in your vehicle, hard-sided trailer or in a bear-proof locker (provided by request to backpackers and motorcycle-campers).

Keep a clean campsite.Dispose of garbage in the bearproof garbage bins provided. Do not burn food refuse or garbage.

Never cook or store food, cooking utensils, toiletries or cosmetics in a tent or tent trailer.

Clean food off barbeques after each use.

Dispose of waste water down the toilets or at the sanitation sinks provided.

Never leave food (including pet food or bowls), or garbage unsecured at your campsite.

Supervise your children at all times.
