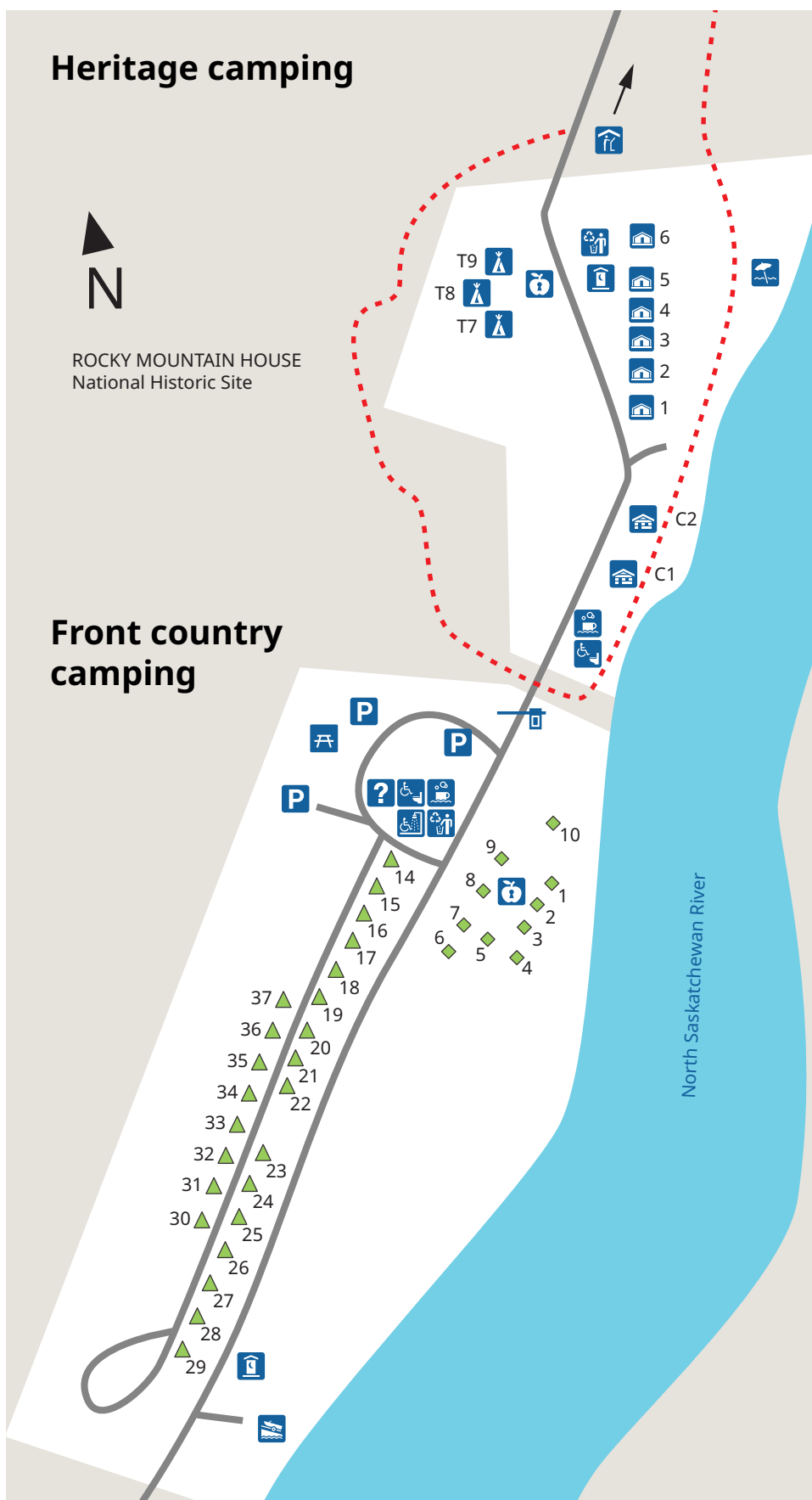

Campfires

Only permitted in designated fire pits between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.



Alcoholic Beverages

During the July long weekend, a complete ban on the possession of alcohol is in effect.



Cannabis

During the July long weekend, a complete ban on the possession of cannabis is in effect.



Do Not Litter

Keep a clean campsite at all times. Deposit all garbage in proper receptacles.



Do Not Feed Any Wildlife

Wildlife need to find their own natural food sources, not yours.



Do Not Pick flowers, wood, rocks

Leave it for others to enjoy.
