

From the aboriginal mound-builders at Lockport, to the walls at Lower Fort Garry, to the 3 historic stone churches along the Red, and the Detroit Red Wings' memorabilia at Skinners Drive-in restaurant, the remnants of St Andrews historic past are here waiting to be explored.



Beginning as a log mission church in 1829, St Andrews became the centre of a vibrant farming community of former HBC employees and their mixed blooded families. The elite of the fur trade era rest in St Andrews Churchyard.

The rector of St Andrews Church and his neighbours hand-built this residence. As missionary and friend of Chief Peguis, Reverend William Cockran established this community and four others in Manitoba.

After his incredible Arctic expeditions in search of Sir John Franklin, William Kennedy settled here with his young wife, Eleanor. For thirty years, they influenced the political, economic and cultural life of this community. Their magnificent riverside gardens are open to the public.



Retirees of the Hudson's Bay Company brought their families to settle this part of the Red River in the 1820s.

Descendants of the Hudson's Bay Company employees started the farms and the communities that became Lockport, Little Britain and St Clements.



ANDERSON FAMILY donated land for St. Thomas Church in Lockport

St Andrews Lock and Dam Built (1910) to flood out the St Andrews Rapids, this Lock and Dam opens a water transportation system that reaches all the way to Edmonton. This area has been a prime fishing area for about 3000 years. It is still a popular destination for weekend fishers, and families for ice cream.
