More than 70 species of fish inhabit the near-pristine waters of Lake Superior, the largest of the Great Lakes. Watch gulls, herons, eagles and pelicans as they feed in these waters. As many as 50 shipwrecks rest within the Lake Superior National Marine Conservation Area, attesting to the power of the lake and its legendary storms.

The management of this vast area will ensure its conservation for the enjoyment and appreciation of present and future generations of Canadians. Traditional activities and ecologically sustainable uses including fishing and boating will continue to be enjoyed.

SNOWSHOEING
When parts of the lake are frozen and safe, Explore!

DOG SLEDDING
Charter a team of furry friends to tour the lake.

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING
Create fresh tracks as you glide across the frozen snow covered lake.

ICE FISHING
Rent a hut on Black Bay or near Gravel River, a perfect day outing.

FISHING
Cast a line in the lake and see what you get. The size of fish may surprise you.

SAILING
Immerse yourself in the sound of nature on the lake without a motor.

WINTER SCUBA DIVING
Dry suit is recommended. The water is warmer than the air in the winter.

WILDLIFE VIEWING
Hurkett Cove Conservation Area offers great birding opportunities.

POWER BOATING
Enjoy the coves & bays in the area. Boat launches are in many communities.

KAYAKING & CANOEING
The waters around Rosspat Islands are a great place for a paddle with protection from the elements.

SWIMMING
Take a dip in the Rosspat waters in late August when the water warms up.

SCUBA DIVING
Many wrecks within the area to explore. Be careful!

SURFING
Huge fall waves around Terrace Bay will tempt the curious surfer.

WILDLIFE VIEWING
Caribou can be seen at the Slate Islands.

CAMPING
Check out local Provincial Park campgrounds.

HIKING
The Casque Isles Trail hugs the shoreline with many spectacular vistas.

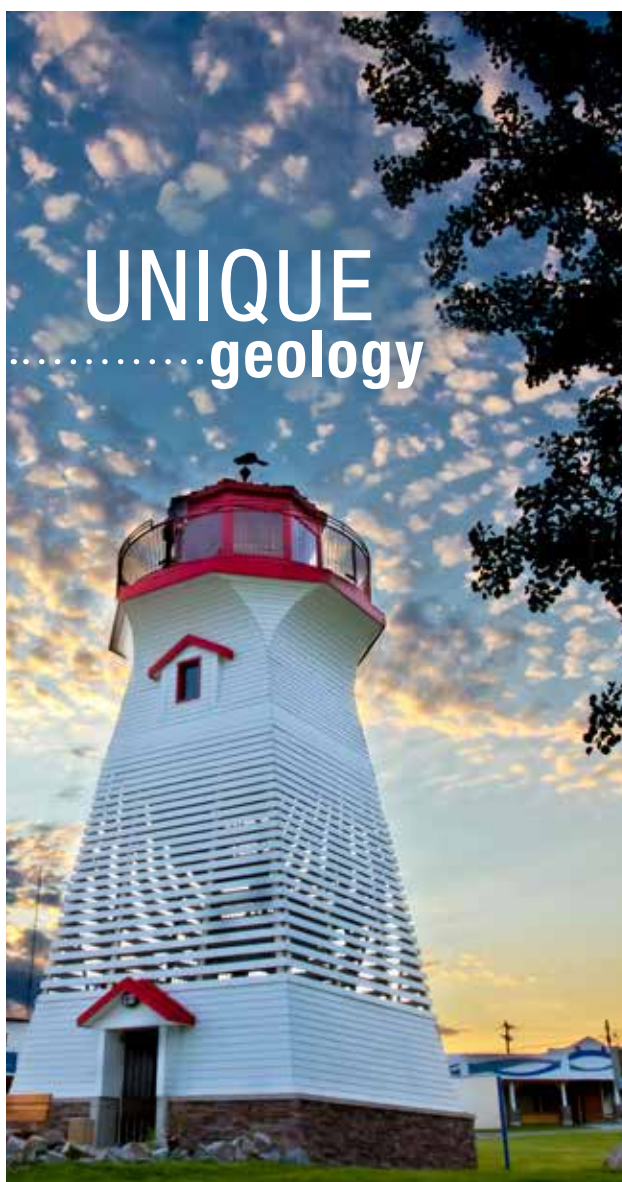
