You'll see the numbers below on the activity pages in your booklet. Find them on these pages to see where to go to do the activities.





During the spring and fall, this cove is full of migratory birds that are flying north or south. They stop at Hurkett Cove to rest before continuing on their long journey.




GO INVESTIGATE P



WETLAND HEROES

Lake Superior's wetlands and shorelands are full of heroes called invertebrates! Invertebrates are animals without a backbone. These tiny creatures have important jobs in the lake! Finding different aquatic invertebrates in a wetland can help us learn if the lake is healthy!

We saved you a seat! Visit the Red Chairs and give your senses a workout! Write down or draw what you discover.




AYE! AYE! CAPTAIN!

Many ships pass through the National Marine Conservation Area. Imagine you and your group are onboard the H.M.S. Superior.

Visit Rossport Community Park and assign someone to be the captain. They will choose the direction you take by crying out "Port" or "Starboard." Your family must run in the proper direction. If someone makes a mistake, everyone yells "Shipwreck" and they must sit down. The last sailor standing wins!

Create a masterpiece at Terrace Bay Beach by drawing in the sand or collecting found objects.


Remember to keep plants planted and leave things you find on the beach for the next Xplorer.


