







DACING OUT THE S.S. KLONDIKE


The S.S. Klondike was the biggest sternwheeler in the British Yukon Navigation Company fleet. As a deckhand, you must know every inch of it. Let's measure it!



CHECK IT OUT &

MONKEY RUDDER'ING'

Keeping afloat on the Yukon River with your cargo and passengers safe takes skill. The river currents, shallow water, rocks, tight turns and rapids could damage or sink your ship. The Pilot used the main and monkey rudders to steer the boat from the Wheelhouse.

S.S. MEANS STEAMSHIP

The S.S. Klondike has a steam engine. To keep the ship moving, firemen loaded lots of wood into the firebox.

Can you see the firebox door?



The wood burned and heated a big tank of water called the "boiler." The hot water turned to steam that went into the engine to power the ship.



When deckhands had free time, they played Quoits, an old ring-toss game. Challenge your family to play individually or in teams at the Visitor Centre.

THE RULES

Each player or team tosses all their rings, then the next player takes a turn.

Players toss their quoits from one board to the other. If you're playing in teams, players toss diagonally from one board to the other. First to have 21 points wins!

HOW TO SCORE

 3 points when you get a "ringer" (ring lands If your opponent gets a ringer on top of yours on the post)


- they get 3 points. • A "leaner" gets 1 point (the ring is leaning
- against the post)


If there are no ringers or leaners, the player

is a "dead quoit" and is out of the game. As long as part of the quoit is on the board,


it is not "dead".







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


